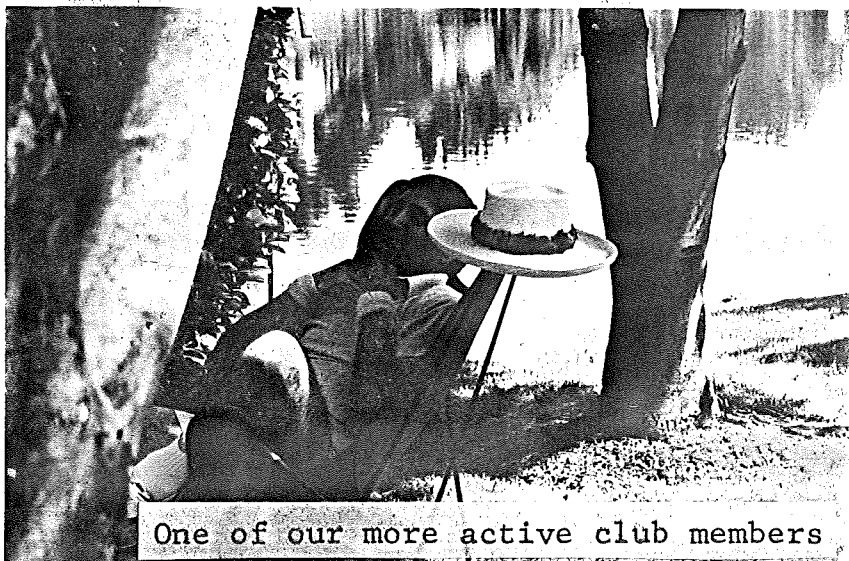

to Glenn Mounger and Jim Tallman.



Past Director's Night February 3, 1982

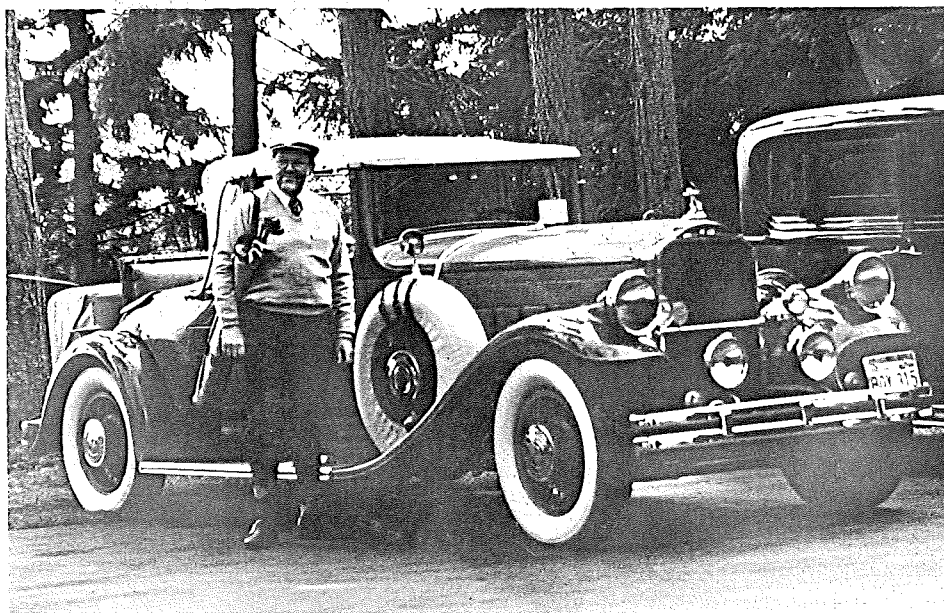
The Board Meeting of the Pacific

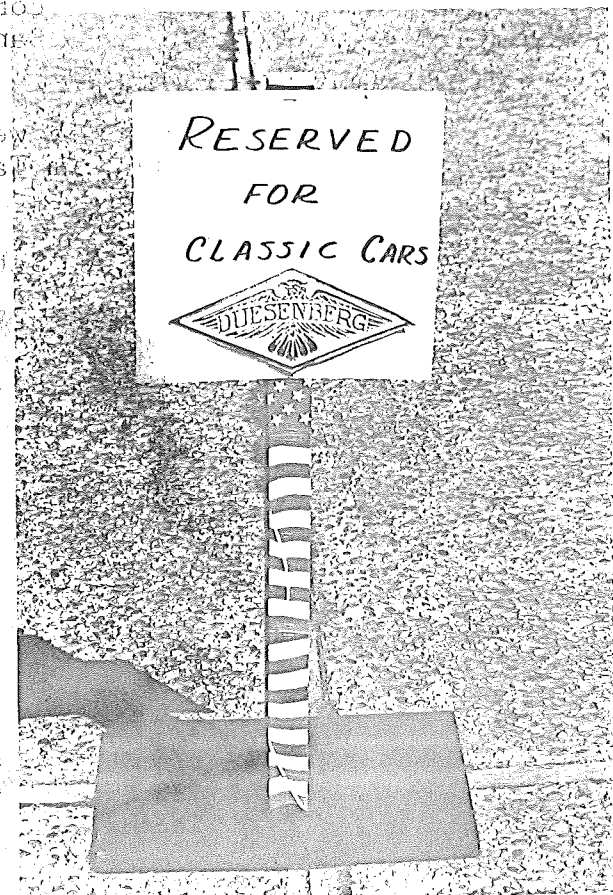
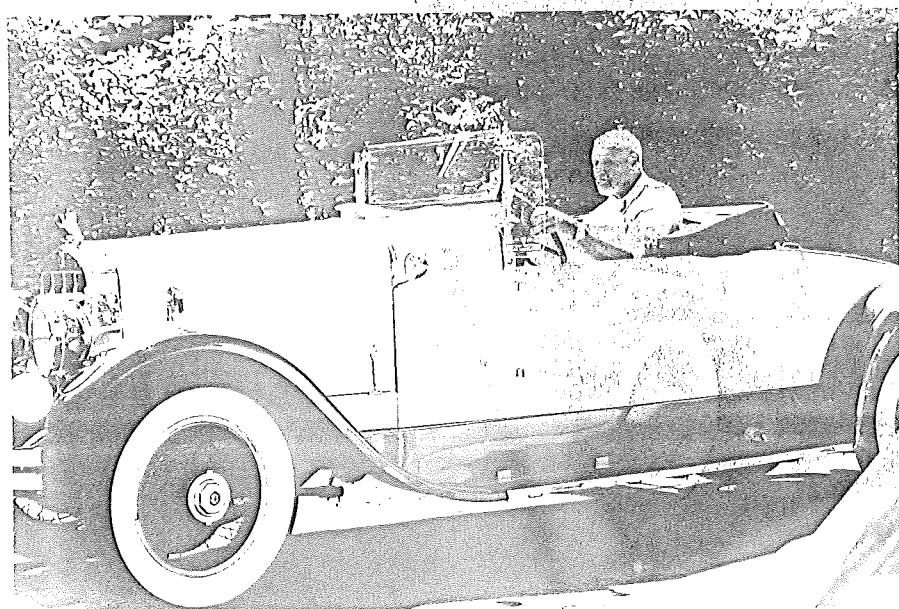

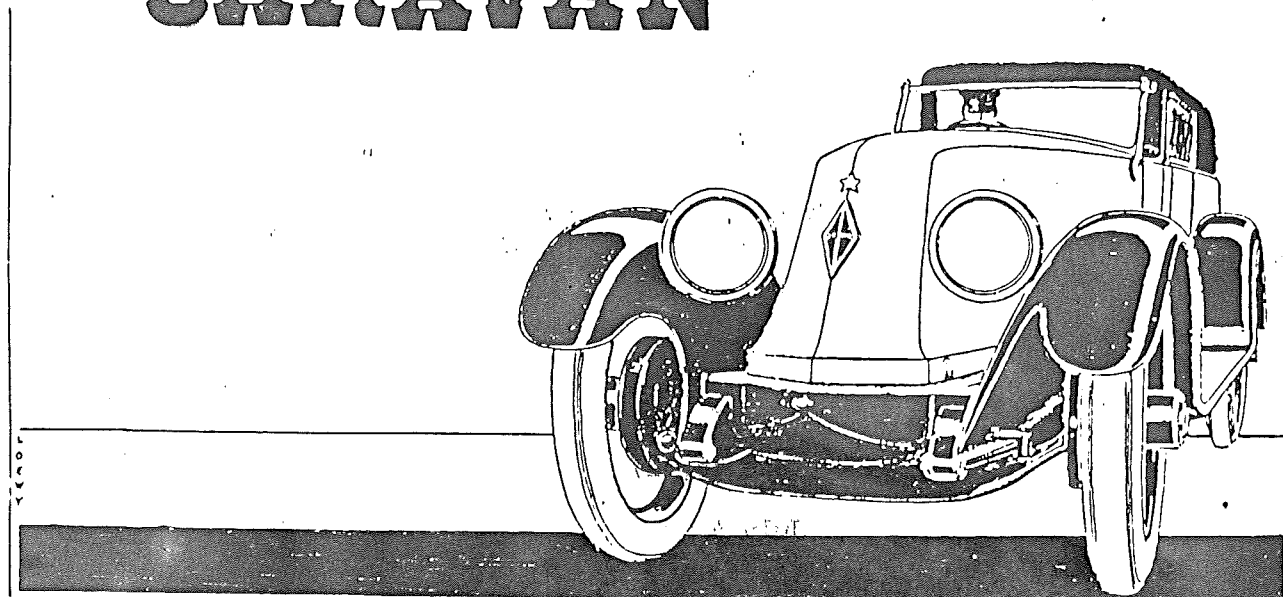


Dumont Staatz and his 1929 Pierce-Arrow
