



The potluck dinner at the McEwans was fun as always. The tables over flowed with goodies. . . . enough for all to eat "too much".

The day ended with a glorious display of fireworks as we all huddles under blankets. What a wonderful day and a super way to celebrate the independence of our great country.



Grand Classics



1933 Stutz, 8, DV32, Phaeton, LeBaron Irving Davis – 100 points




1933 Auburn, 12, 12-161A, Phaeton, Sedan Richard K. Law – 100 points





1937 Packard 12, 1507 Convertible Coupe Chris Bock – 100 points




1938 Packard 12, 1608 Dual Cowl, Phaeton, Rollston Robert L. Meyer – 100 points




Hundreds of vendors and lots of customers
