# Finefrock new editor of Bumper Guardian

New editor/publisher of *The Bumper Guardian* is longtime automotive editor Bill Finefrock, who got "volunteered" for the job after his recent return to Washington state from the large state to the south.

Bill, who grew up in Port Angeles, almost returned to his roots, settling some 16 miles east at Sequim Bay, WA.

The new editor has had a long and varied career in automotive publishing. He was co-owner and editor/publisher of Competition Press (later Auto Week), had served as automotive editor of Pacific Stars and Stripes, editor of the 7th Division Bayonet newspaper, publisher of Sports Car, the monthly magazine of the Sports Car Club of America, and automotive columnist for the Chicago Daily News.

Finefrock has owned numerous publications, ranging from a daily newspaper to weeklies and monthlies. His most recent endeavor is co-publisher and editor of *Collector Car News*, the sale of which is currently being negotiated.

He also has organized the Reno, NV, swap meet since the Harrah organization quit operating the event a decade ago and also organizes the classic car marque display for the San Francisco International Automobile Show each November. The swap meet is now operated in conjunction with Reno's Hot August Nights event the first weekend of August each year.

Bill is a Cord and Cadillac nut, and owns a 1937 Cord Phaeton, a 40-year-old restoration (purchased from PNWR/CCCA's Tom Crook and Larry Justice), and a 1941 Cadillac 4-door convertible, just completing restoration, which he was had for 30 years.

Finefrock replaces Bob and Louise Gerrity, who decided it was time for more fishin' now that Bob has retired -- and less publishin!


