- June 18th also will have a motorcycle show hosted by the LeMay Family Collection
- July 4th is the return of the traditional Yarrow Point Parade and celebration. Bring a significant car and candy to throw at to the kids. Hot dogs, drinks, dessert are all available after the parade for a nominal fee. Parade starts at 11:00; come by 10:00 to decorate and get a spot in line.

PNR-CCCA Board Business:

- The Board talked about the PNR-CCCA Motoring Classic Kickoff which will be held at the Hagerty Garage and Social with registration of the cars moved are now 11:00 am to 1:00 pm. At 1:30 the participants of the Motoring Classic are planning to depart. Expect light snacks.
- David Smith brought up the idea of revisiting the Naval bases on Whidbey and the peninsula. Other possible targets for a Club event are a tour of the Boeing assembly line and a possible chance to get a tour of the Blue Origin facilities. We will move this forward.
- Al McEwan brought up the elephant in the room given that we approved in May to support a 2023 CARavan. Al
 pointed out that it is good for the Region and good for the hobby, but it is a lot of work. The suggestion was to
 craft some combination of the 2010, 2015 and 2019 treks and so we would look to start in Kirkland and head to
 Eastern Washington and on to British Columbia. Limit would be 50 cars. Al would be the decider, but delegate
 some of the more time-consuming responsibilities. Dates and routes to be the first focus.
- Al moved and Steve seconded electing Brian to be the official Club Secretary. Frank tied Brian's arms, so the vote was unanimous.
- Warren Lubow has not been able to carve out the time to be a Manager of the Club. Tom Alberts was nominated and voted in by a unanimous approval. Welcome Tom!
