LeMay America's Car Museum Update

It has been a very busy summer at ACM. The celebration of the 75th Anniversary of Porsche opened in April. 600 plus people were waiting for the doors of the Museum to open that Saturday for the Grand Opening. Hundreds of Porsches covered the Museum Plaza and every parking lot as far as one could see. The exhibit will continue to rotate the cars being displayed and will remain until April 2024 at which time a major Japanese Car Display will be unveiled. The big event of the summer was the GALA, which is the major fund raiser of the year. This is a glitzy gown and black-tie affair which sells out yearly and raised over \$1M used to keep the Museum doors open.

September also featured Wagonfest, an event limited to Station Wagons attracted nearly 300 vehicles to the Haub Show Field. Keenon Greenfield was the only PNR CCCA member present showing her 2014 Cadillac CTS Sport Wagon. This event was co-sponsored by Avants Car Club, an up-and-coming organization whose focus is DRIVING! This event was a major success and will return next year. October 6th ushered in a unique Corvette display honoring the 70th Anniversary of America's Sports Car. Friday evening was a private showing for exhibitors and Concours Club Members. Saturday the Plaza was filled with Corvettes and hundreds of viewers were waiting for the Museum doors to open.
