Use the right 2 lanes to take exit 189 to merge onto WA-526 W toward
Mukilteo/Whidbey Island Ferry for 3.2 mi
Use the right 2 lanes to take the Airport Rd exit toward Paine Field
Use any lane to turn left onto Airport Rd for 1.4mi
Turn right onto Minuteman Dr. for 0.4 mi
Turn right onto 112th St SW and then right onto 30th Ave W
Continue straight onto 109th St SW
Slight left to stay on 109th St SW - destination will be on the right

Best of the West CARavan 2024

May 13-23, 2024

PLEASE JOIN US as we visit some of the most beautiful areas in Northern California. This is a modified Hub Tour, avoiding freeways, searching out back roads and keeping the average daily mileage to 110 miles. This is a great tour for early Classics. We are prepared to store your car well in advance of or after the tour to help you save on shipping expenses or enjoy other West Coast events.

What to Expect

For most touring days, in addition to scheduled stops, we'll provide you with a list of choices along the route. There will be opportunities to add wineries, antique stores, museums, shopping, spas, balloon rides, even white water rafting in order to tailor parts of the tour to your liking. Overall, we plan to show you the Best of the West.

Sacramento

We start our tour in the State Capitol staying along the Sacramento River, walking distance from "Old Town", the Crocker Art Museum and probably the best railroad museum to be found.

Sacramento has one of the easiest airports to use in the State. This area forms the



beginning of the Delta, with its confluence of multiple rivers and its Mississippi River feel. We will spend two nights here at the beginning and one night here at the end of our journey.

The Gold Country

The discovery of gold in California not only changed the history of the State but it changed the history of the United States. Imagine finding flakes of gold, or better yet, gold nuggets in the nearby streams. Not only did that happen, it sometimes still happens today as the Sierra Nevada streams and rivers rush through the granite mountains. The second part of our journey takes us slowly up into the foothills. We will spend one night in Grass Valley, home to the Empire Mine. We will then head past Auburn and Placerville

and stay at the Murietta Inn and Spa. We will spend three nights here using this comfortable and modern Inn as the launching spot for visits to the heart of the Gold Country and its beautiful and quaint small towns. While in the area we will see some great treasures, including the magnificent Giant Sequoias, which grow only one place in the world, the western slope of the Sierra Nevada Mountains. Along the way you will learn how to pan for gold, visit the actual spot that gold was first found and get to examine a 44 pound gold nugget.

Napa Valley Wine Country

As one of the most visited tourist spots in the Country, we have used local knowledge to give you a closeup view that few get to see. We will stay all four nights at the Archer, a wonderful boutique hotel in the center of downtown Napa. Shopping, great restaurants, wine tasting will be a short walk away. We will begin with a visit to the rugged Northern California coast and of course, a visit to a grove of California Coastal Redwoods. Our following days will be filled with a wonderful car collection, great food, incredible wineries, back roads and some special treats. On the final day we will take some very interesting roads back to Sacramento for our final banquet.

Activity Fee

The Activity Fee will be \$1800 per person and will cover most meals (about 25), great special events, wine tastings, entry fees, trouble truck, and more. This fee may be paid in two equal installments, so long as the final payment is made by March 1, 2024. The fee is fully refundable on or before March 1, 2024 and NOT refundable thereafter.
